## **Explore Hyde Park by bike tour**

Explore the history and architecture of the Hyde Park neighborhood by bike Sunday with the Active Transportation Alliance, Big Shoulders Realty and Friends of the Major Taylor Trail. The free guided tour begins at 1 p.m. in Washington Park, 5531 S. Martin Luther King Drive.

Hyde Park lends itself to discovery by bicycle. The busy University of Chicago campus, the sprawling Midway Plaisance, the inlet lagoon and the Wooded Isle in Jackson Park are far easier to see on two wheels than four. Riders will view works by great architects, sculptors and landscape architects, including Frank Lloyd Wright, Frederick Olmsted, Lorado Taft, Howard Van Doren Shaw, Dwight Perkins, George and William Keck, and Ludwig Mies Van der Rohe.

Tours are typically 12 to 18 miles with narrated stops.
